

What does the class include?

Each student will attend 30 hours of classroom training, which includes the State-required Alcohol and Drug Awareness (ADAP) training. Students will also complete 6 hours of private, individual behind-the-wheel (BTW) training with a licensed driver training instructor. Graduates are eligible for a 10% reduction in insurance premiums to drivers under 25 years of age, if otherwise qualified; and parents are eligible for a \$150 Georgia Income Tax Credit. Certificates of Completion will be issued when all thirty hours of classroom activities have been completed, the final exam has been successfully passed and the six hours of behind-the-wheel instruction have been completed.

How much does the course cost?

The thirty hours of classroom and six hours of private behind the wheel (BTW) training costs \$475 for MJCCA and/or BBYO members. For everyone else, the cost is \$490.

How old do I need to be?

A student must be turning fifteen years of age within 30 days of the last class.

Do I have to have a permit?

Although a student can take the classroom portion of the course prior to having a permit, he or she MUST have their permit before starting BTW lessons.

How do I enroll in the class?

To enroll, register online at www.atlantajcc.org/teens. Enrollment is open for each class session until the maximum number of twenty-five students is reached.

What if I miss a classroom session?

All missed classroom sessions must be made up either at the MJCCA or at the driving school's (Taggarts or Safe America, depending on which one is teaching your session) location. Make up sessions must be scheduled through Linda Citron (linda.citron@atlantajcc.org).

How does the schedule for the behind-the-wheel lessons work?

Behind-The-Wheel instruction is conducted on an individual basis and is not part of the 30 hours of classroom instruction and cannot take place during the hours that classroom instruction is scheduled. Students will be provided the name and contact information for their Behind-The-Wheel instructor on the first day of classroom instruction. Students must contact their assigned Behind-The-Wheel instructor directly to schedule the BTW training, which is conducted in 2 or 3-hour (minimum) increments. The student is picked up and returned to the home or another location by the instructor. Behind-The-Wheel training must be completed within six months of the first class. If not completed within that timeframe, the unfinished portion of training will be forfeited without remuneration.
