We turn everyday minutes into Jewish moments that are remembered for a lifetime.

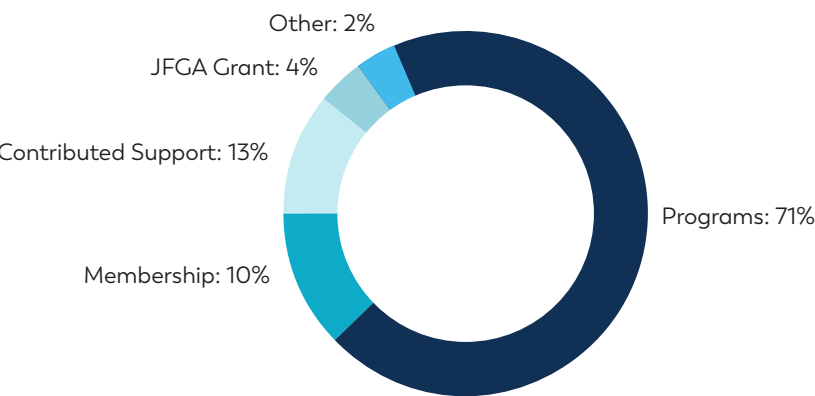
MJCCA Vision
