No stranger to all things weird and wonderful, Bellows (the pseudonym of songwriter and producer Oliver Kalb) is on the road with fellow Brooklynites and art collective members violinist Gabrielle Smith (Eskimeaux), drummer Felix Walworth (Told Slant) and guitarist Henry Crawford (Small Wonder). Bellows elevates bedroom pop with gloomy synth tones and nostalgic lyrics, as showcased in the group's third full-length, *Fist & Palm* (Double Double Whammy). All songs are written by Kalb and recorded with the group's spirit of DIT — "do it together." In his most perplexing project to date, *Strand* (released July 4 via Shelter Press), Kalb offers a rare look into his creative process in eight instrumental tracks.
