He is the author or co-author of roughly 150 publications and serves in various editorial capacities for several academic journals. His research interests include international developments in the information technologies (IT), IT and national security, critical infrastructure resilience, and related public policy issues. Sy's secondary research interests include the impact of science and technology on the American Civil War, World War II, and the Cold War. His topic is: Jewish Scientists of World War II.

Cary King is a decorated veteran of the U.S. Army and National Guard. He served in the Infantry and Artillery units in Vietnam in the '60s, and was later awarded five Bronze Stars, an Army Commendation Medal with "V" Device for valor, and numerous other awards.
